HUNT FOR 4 ABDUCTED IN SPEEDWAY AREA

Police Baffled By Kidnappings

Police fanned out in the Speedway area Saturday trying to unravel the mysterious abduction of four employees during an overnight holdup at a Burger Chef restaurant.

Speedway reserve and off-duty policemen formed search parties on foot while police helicopters scanned from above. A statewide alert was issued on the missing persons and the FBI offered assistance.

The four employees - an assistant manager and three teen-agers - were abducted sometime between 11 p.m. and midnight Friday during a robbery at the restaurant, 5725 Crawfordsville Road.

POLICE THEORIZED that the four employees were forced to leave the store in a white 1974. Vega owned by the

assistant manager, Jane C. Friedt, 20, but said it appeared they left without a

The Vega was found early Saturday in the 5500 block of West 15th Street, a block and a half from Speedway Police headquarters. The door on the driver's side was locked, but the passenger door was not,

It was believed less than \$500 was taken in the holdup.

The other three missing persons were identified as Ruth Shelton, 17, a junior at Northwest High School; Daniel Davis, 16, a junior at Decatur Central High School, and Mark Flemmonds, also 16, a sophomore at Speedway High School.

Another employee, Ginger Haggard, 17, said Flemmonds originally was not scheduled to work Friday night, but agreed to switch shifts with her.

Haggard said.
"It's kind of scary," she added. "I feel awfully bad about the whole thing."

Police described the kidnappings as a "serious abduction," ruling out the possibility of a prank.

"If I thought this was a kids' prank I sure as heck wouldn't have stayed up all night working on it," Lt. William Crafton

NEVERTHELESS, authorities admitted they were stumped by the "very peculiar" kidnappings, for which there was no apparent motive. None of the families involved have received any ransom demands and no witnesses have been found, Crafton said.

4 Killed As Winter Storm Hits

A blinding snowstorm whistled across the upper Midwest Saturday, burying some communities under more than a foot of snow and causing scattered power

Three persons in Minnesota died while clearing snow and one person in Michigan was killed in a traffic accident since the storm began Friday.

The storm, the first of the season to turn its full fury on northern Wisconsin and upper Michigan, dumped 15 inches of snow in northeastern Wisconsin.

Savage winds downed power lines and knocked out electricity in much of Vilas County, in extreme northeastern Wisconsin near the Michigan border. Snow plows were kept off the roads by savage winds that whipped snow into blinding

Rep. Ryan, Newsmen Are Reported Slain In S. America Attack

Washington (AP) - The State Department said late Saturday it has been told Rep. Leo J. Ryan (D-Calif.) and a number of reporters have been shot and killed after an attack on the congressman's fact finding mission at the airport in Port Kaituma, Guyana.

Ryan was leading a 13-person dele-gation investigating a controversial American religious settlement at Jonestown in the South American country.



Miss Friedt, described as a "very reliable person" and "well liked," has been assistant manager at the restaurant on Crawfordsville Road the last three months, and has been employed by the chain three years. She is a 1976 graduate of Avon High School.

Police theorize that she and the others closed the restaurant as usual at 11 p.m. Friday and began cleaning up — a proc-ess that normally-takes until 1 or 2 a.m.

Police said an off-duty employee who was passing the restaurant about 12:15 a.m. called police after he stopped to help with the clean-up and discovered a back door open about three inches.

The employee, Brian Kring, 17, said he entered the building, found no one there and noticed that cash register drawers were on the floor. The manager's office was in disarray and on the floor was a jacket he remembered seeing Miss Shelton wearing earlier Friday.

Kring said the back door of the building normally is locked, but speculated the employees had unlocked it to take trash outside to a nearby receptacle because several trash containers were just inside the back door.

Police found two empty currency bags and an empty roll of adhesive tape next to the open safe in the manager's office. The safe contained several rolls of

Two purses belonging to the female employees were in the restaurant. Police believe all four victims still were wearing their brown and orange uniforms at the

time of the abduction. Mrs. Friedt said security at the Burg-er Chef has been "excellent" since eight still-unsolved bombings occurred in Speedway in September. The restaurant is across the street from the Speedway Shopping Center where some of the blasts
